Proclamation

**Governor's Proclamation Declaring the Result of the Election of November 4, 2014,
for Constitutional Amendments**

WHEREAS, The General Assembly of Maryland at its Regular Session of 2013 enacted Chapter 422 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2013, "Transportation Trust Fund - Use of Funds"; and at its Regular Session of 2014 enacted Chapter 261 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2014, "Chief Executive Officer or County Executive - Special Election to Fill a Vacancy in Office" proposing amendments to the Constitution of Maryland;

WHEREAS, The above recited Acts and Article XIV of the Constitution, provide for the submission of the amendments to the legal and qualified voters of the State for their adoption or rejection, at the election held on November 4, 2014; and

WHEREAS, The Acts were submitted to the legal and qualified voters of the State during that election and from the certified copies of the returns of the election were as follows:

As to Chapter 422 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2013 relating to Transportation Trust Fund - Use of Funds (Question No. 01): 1,283,053 votes were cast for the adoption, and 288,411 votes were cast against the adoption; and

As to Chapter 261 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2014 relating to Chief Executive Officer or County Executive - Special Election to Fill a Vacancy in Office (Question No. 02): 1,244,113 votes were cast for the adoption, and 300,607 votes were cast against the adoption;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARTIN O'MALLEY, GOVERNOR, pursuant to Section 1 of Article XIV of the Constitution of Maryland, do, by this Proclamation, declare and proclaim that Chapter 422 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2013, and Chapter 261 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2014, having received the majority of votes cast for the adoption, shall become parts of the Constitution of the State of Maryland.
