



Maryland's primary election is **May 14, 2024**, but you may be able to vote earlier depending on how you choose to cast your ballot. There are three ways to vote, so use this checklist to make a plan. If you need assistance registering or finding a polling place, visit **vote.md.gov/vote2024**.



REGISTRATION

Generally, you must be registered with either the Democratic or Republican Party to vote in the primary election. If you do not select a political party on your voter registration application, you will be "unaffiliated" with any political party, meaning you will only be able to vote in nonpartisan primary elections held in your jurisdiction.

I'm registered to vote.

If you're planning to register the same day you vote, be sure to bring a document that proves where you live. Any one of these examples can be used to prove your address:

- Your MVA-issued license
- ID card
- Change of address card
- Your paycheck
- A bank statement
- A utility bill
- Any government document with your name and address

Choose a way to vote and then check each box until you've voted in person or by mail.
