## EXECUTIVE ORDER 01.01.2012.24

## Executive Order Regarding Hurricane Sandy and Early Voting

WHEREAS, A State of Emergency has been declared throughout the

State of Maryland in recognition of the danger posed by

Hurricane Sandy and related weather systems;

WHEREAS, The current State of Emergency will interfere with the early

voting that is scheduled to take place by law from Saturday, October 27, 2012 through Thursday, November 1, 2012;

WHEREAS, A cancellation of early voting on Monday, October 29,

2012 and Tuesday, October 30, 2012 was necessary to protect public safety and minimize the risk of harm to all

Marylanders, including those who play a role in

administering the electoral process;

WHEREAS, It is in the interests of the State of Maryland and the

electoral process to extend early voting hours on the

remaining early voting days in order to make up for the lost

opportunities for early voting; and

WHEREAS, In order to implement the emergency powers of the

Governor, an executive order of the Governor is

appropriate.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARTIN O'MALLEY, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE

OF MARYLAND, BY VIRTUE OF THE AUTHORITY VESTED IN ME BY THE CONSTITUTION AND THE LAWS OF MARYLAND, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO TITLE 8, SECTION 103 OF THE ELECTION LAW ARTICLE OF THE ANNOTATED

CODE OF MARYLAND, DECLARE THAT THE STATE OF EMERGENCY IN EFFECT FOR ALL COUNTIES WILL INTERFERE WITH THE ELECTORAL PROCESS AND THAT THE FOLLOWING CHANGES TO THE EARLY VOTING SCHEDULE ARE NECESSARY:

A. All early voting centers shall be open between 8 a.m. and 9 p.m. on Wednesday, October 31, 2012, Thursday, November 1, 2012, and Friday, November 2, 2012.
