Post-Election Canvassing of Mail-In Ballots Scheduled for June 25

Members of the Public May Observe the Canvass at Local Boards of Elections

ANNAPOLIS (June 24, 2026) — Maryland’s post-election canvass of mail-in ballots for the Gubernatorial Primary Election will begin on Thursday, June 25. Local boards of elections will be opening, reviewing, and counting mail-in ballots that have been returned. Members of the public may observe the canvass.

“Watching democracy in action is inspiring, so we remind members of the public they may observe the canvass at their local board of elections,” said State Elections Administrator Jared DeMarinis. “Maryland’s canvass process is open, transparent, and conducted in compliance with all relevant laws and regulations. I want to thank all our boards of canvassers and bipartisan canvass teams for working tirelessly to count every vote, and ensure every vote counts.”
