Three In-Person Voting Locations Announced for 7th Congressional District Special Election

Board continues to encourages all voters who can vote by mail to do so

Update: Annapolis, MD (April 16, 2020) - The Maryland State Board of Elections (the Board) today announced that local boards of elections have selected three in-person voting centers for the April 28th 7th Congressional District special election. The locations are in Baltimore City, Baltimore County, and Howard County.

The Board continues to urge all 7th District voters to vote by mail if they are able to do so. The State Board mailed ballots to all eligible active voters in early April along with return envelopes and prepaid postage. Voters do <u>not</u> need to affix postage to their envelopes.

If a voter is unable to vote by mail, the following in-person voting centers will be open April 28th from 7 am to 8 pm.

For Baltimore City voters who live in the 7th Congressional District:

For Baltimore County voters who live in the 7th Congressional District:

Martin's West 6817 Dogwood Road Windsor Mill 21244

For Howard County voters who live in the 7th Congressional District:

"I want to thank election officials in Baltimore City, Baltimore County, and Howard County for moving swiftly to identify these locations," said Linda H. Lamone, Administrator of State Elections. "These centers are being made available on April 28th for voters who are unable to vote by mail. We strongly encourage all other voters to vote safely and conveniently by mail."

Maryland's 7th Congressional District covers portions of the City of Baltimore, Baltimore County, and Howard County, respectively. The special election is being held to fill the remainder of the term of the 116th Congress due to the passing of Representative Elijah Cummings in October 2019.
