Maryland State Board of Elections Posts 2024 Presidential General Election Ballots for Review

For National Voter Registration Month, SBE Urges Marylanders to Register to Vote

ANNAPOLIS (September 2, 2024) – The Maryland State Board of Elections (SBE) today announced that the 2024 Presidential general election ballots have been certified and posted for review on its website, https://elections.maryland.gov/elections/2024/index.html#gballots.

A registered voter has until close of business on September 4 to seek judicial review of the certified ballots. SBE will review verified submissions from registered voters in the state and make any necessary ballot changes before beginning the ballot printing process. Voters with questions regarding a ballot can email SBE at info.sbe@maryland.gov.

"Ballot review by registered voters is a critical part of an open and trusted election process," said State Administrator Jared DeMarinis. "We encourage Maryland voters to review the ballots and stay informed on the 2024 Presidential general election voting process by regularly visiting our website and following us on social media."

In honor of National Voter Registration Month this September, SBE also encourages eligible residents who are not registered to vote to do so using the <u>online registration system</u>, which also allows registered voters to change party affiliation, update their address, and update their name if it has changed. A voter registration form can also be printed (<u>English</u> version and <u>Spanish</u> version) and submitted to the office of a resident's <u>local board of elections</u>.

For the 2024 Presidential general election, registered voters can vote in one of three different ways: early in-person at select locations, mail-in ballot or in-person on election day at their designated polling place. To request a mail-in ballot, visit
