Last Chance to Register and Vote for Special Primary Election for the 7th Congressional District

Annapolis, Maryland (January 28, 2020): Eligible Maryland residents who live in the 7th Congressional District can register and vote on election day, February 4, 2020. If all of the requirements are met, the individual can register, mark, and tabulate his or her ballot at the polling place.

To register and vote on election day, an individual must be eligible to vote in Maryland, go to the correct polling place where he or she lives, and bring a document proving residency. The documents that prove residency are a Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) issued driver's license, ID card, or change of address card, or a paycheck, bank statement, utility bill, or other government document with individual's name and current address. The same day registration process is available on election day; however, address, party or name changes cannot be changed on election day.

In the 7th Congressional District, there are a total of 315 polling places covering parts of Baltimore City, Baltimore County, and Howard County. Each polling place will be open from 7:00 am to 8:00 pm, on Tuesday, February 4th. Registered voters who are unsure if they reside in the 7th Congressional District can use the Voter Lookup tool to find out their congressional district and if they live in the 7th Congressional District, where to vote, by visiting voterservices.elections.maryland.gov/VoterSearch. Those who are not registered and want to register and vote on election day can find out their correct polling place by using the Polling Place Lookup tool by visiting voterservices.elections.maryland.gov/PollingPlaceSearch.
